Area Characteristics (Sensory Zones)

A

- Large open area
- Main entry to Sensory Garden
- Information board

1

'FEEL' area

- Relatively open area
- Close to pond and water access
- Incorporation of water
- Retain seasonal ground moss

2

'SEE' area

- Relatively open and most central of the area
- Visually connects all areas as well as visually drawing visitors into the centre of the sensory garden

3

'SMELL' area

- Hidden area

4

'HEAR' area

- Most secluded area
- Ideal as 'HEAR' area as furthest away from potential noise
- Bird sounds most obvious in this area

5

'TASTE' area

- Relatively open area
- Very close to grassland enclosure
- Close area to existing path network
- Area for edible plants /bush tucker
